## BY THE GLASS

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### CHAMPAGNE & SPARKLING (125ml)

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**NV Pol Roger – Brut Reserve** (Champagne, France) 29

Classic nose of baked brioche, hazelnuts and superb length, a classy way to start your day.

**NV Laherte & Freres – Rose de Meunier** (Champagne, France) 35

Rich and deep- delicious rose fizz expressing sweet red fruit and outstanding aroma. 100% Pinot Meunier, Saignee style.

**2017 Jansz – Vintage Cuvee** (Pipers River, TAS) 19

4 years on lees, intense aromas of citrus zest, lemon curd and sweet brioche.

### WHITE WINES (150ml)

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#### Crisp & Mineral

**2016 Dry River** Riesling (Martinborough, NZ) 23

Punchy and so alive. Lime, slate and spice flavours but it's the palate intensity and power that makes this riesling world class...

**2018 Fritz Haag – Brauneberger Juffer Kabinett** Riesling (Mosel, Germany) 20

Lovely peach, herb and floral aromas combined with a refreshing and precise combination of acid and sugar...wow!

**2019 De la Pepiere – Clos de Briords** Melon de Bourgogne (Loire Valley, France) 17

Old-vine cuvee -this is my kind of Muscadet- textbook with everything you would expect, lemon, apple and great salinity.

**2018 Thibaud Boudignon Anjou** Chenin Blanc (Loire Valley, France) 26

Layers of ripe nectarine and lemon sherbet fruit, a fleshy, open knit texture and a twist of powdery extract on the tonic finish.

**2019 De Ladoucette – Comte Lafond Sancerre** Sauvignon Blanc (Loire Valley, France) 25

Delicate floral notes followed by powerful mineral aromas- elegant bouquet, complex and typical of the richness of this great terroir

#### Fruit Driven

**2019 Rockford – Local Growers** Semillon (Barossa Valley, SA) 15

Light golden color, toasted and buttery citrus, touch of smokiness, deep and textured

**2020 Saint Clair** Sauvignon Blanc (Marlborough, NZ) 14

Passionfruit with a floral lift- rich palate with passionfruit and a salty minerality. This wine has a silky luscious texture with a long finish

**2020 Tiefenbrunner – Merus** Pinot Grigio (Alto Adige, Italy) 15

Unobtrusive bouquet, hints of pear and candied fruit. The strong harmonious structure emphasizes its dry full-bodied taste & round finish

#### Rich & Full-bodied

**2019 Dm. Christophe & Fils** Chardonnay (Chablis, France) 22

What a powerhouse, a chardonnay with high acidity, no oak, no creaminess. Lots of pink grapefruit, lime and body.

**2017 Vasse Felix – Heytesbury** Chardonnay (Margaret River, WA) 38

Grace and power, complex flavour, matchsticky, grapefruity, steeliness, pulp and creamy,.....just a fabulous wine.

**2019 Tolpuddle** Chardonnay (Coal River, TAS) 33

A marvellous wine of great delicacy allied to great intensity. The palate is precise and focused, seamless and harmonious- 100% malolactic

### ORANGE WINE (150ml)

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**2016 Castagna – Harlequin** (Beechworth, VIC) 20

White made like a red, step out of your comfort zone, spent 30 days on skins, to extract phenolics & tannins. SERVED CELLAR TEMPERATURE.

## ROSE WINE (150ml)

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2021 Brokenwood – Rosato (Hunter Valley, NSW) 15

Made from Nebbiolo, which has a floral element to its aroma of Turkish delight and rose water with zesty acidity.

2020 Domaine Tempier (Bandol, France) 22

An intense fruit and floral nose make this an attractive rosé. The palate is rounded and full with fruity aromas of peach and pomegranate, followed by delicate spice notes and a pleasant freshness created by acidic balance.

## RED WINES (150ml)

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### Light & Elegant

2018 Grange Cochard *Morgon* Gamay Noir (Beaujolais, France) 20

A wine which grape juice nerds love. Elegant and funky at the same time, works well with food.

2013 Domaine Faiveley *Gevrey-Chambertin* Pinot Noir (Burgundy, France) 29

Wild unripe raspberries, dried herbs and great acidity, a fine expression of Gevrey

2019 Pooley – Butchers Hill Pinot Noir (Coal River, TAS) 25

Ripe raspberry, rose, bay leaf and herbal nuance. Black earth shitake undertones. Black cherry, soy and ginger... Last word, DELICIOUS!

2015 Sangreal By Farr Pinot Noir (Geelong, VIC) 36

One of Oldest by Farr vineyards expressing some of the most perfumed, robust and yet refined pinot noirs in Australia- not to be missed

### Something in Between

2014 Marcarini – Brunate *Barolo* Nebbiolo (Piedmont, Italy) 45

Spice, natural rubber, asphalt, tar, root beer. A "grand cru" of Barolo and undoubtedly a producer who over-delivers for the money

2017 Rockford – Moppa Springs Grenache Blend (Barossa Valley, SA) 16

A fine example of southern rhone blend with aussie magic. Medium bodied, lots of dark fruit, needs some air at this point to highlight...

2017 Isole E Olena *Chianti Classico* Sangiovese (Tuscany, Italy) 21

A spicy, pure expression of Sangiovese and an authentic chianti classico. Morello dark cherry, fragrant floral aromas of violet, freshly cut herbs.

2019 Wirra Wirra – Woodhenge Shiraz (McLaren Vale, SA) 18

Deep crimson with a vibrant purple edge. Blackberry, plum and dark chocolate, spiced with star anise and fresh cedar.

2010 Guigal *Hermitage* Syrah (Northern Rhone, France) 42

Aroma of bacon, herb, violet and liquorice. Silky tannins. Savoury palate with black pepper and herbs- an absolute steal for hermitage!

### Structure and Powerful

2006 Kilikanoon – Oracle Shiraz (Clare Valley, SA) 40

Nose filled with plums, violets, olive and coffee. On the palate the wine is smooth and structured. Good balance between power and elegance.

2012 Rockford – Basket Press Shiraz (Barossa Valley, SA) 49

Big, ripe, range and solid, with smoky, meaty black cherry and coffee flavours, dried mint notes

2017 Standish – The Relic Shiraz | Viognier (Barossa Valley, SA) 40

Grilled meat, lavender, blueberry and blackberry, dark spices and vanilla. Full bodied, thick with sheets of dense, compact tannins.

2018 Yalumba – Cigar Cabernet Sauvignon (Coonawarra, SA) 17

Big and juicy Aussie Cab, touch of dried mint leaves on the nose. Easy and uncomplicated.

2008 Domaine A Cabernet | Merlot Blend (Coal River, TAS) 35

This wine is more Bordeaux than it ever will be Australian. Refined and bold tannins with black cassis and a touch dark chocolate.

## CHAMPAGNE The Little Growers

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The grower champagne movement has been the most profound transformation in the champagne landscape of the last 50 years. Traditionally, Champagne's 15.800 growers took responsibility only for growing the grapes, while the production and sale of the region's wines were the Grande Marquee (negociant houses) and co-operatives.

Grower champagnes are typically smaller in production than big houses , often capturing the expression of a group of villages or even single village/vineyard.
